Our program delivery methods include:

- School Club- Requires six (6) hours of in-school instructional programming. Classrooms will elect club officers such as President, Vice President, Secretary, Reporter, and Club Assistant.
- School Enrichment- Requires six (6) hours of in-school instructional programming.
- After School- Requires six (6) hours of after school instructional programming.
- Community Base Projects/Clubs- Requires six (6) hours of instructional programming.

# SCHOOL CLUBS

4-H empowers young people with the skills to lead for a lifetime. It's a research-based experience that includes hands-on projects and a meaningful leadership opportunity. School clubs offer 4-H'ers the opportunity to build life skills by leading hands-on projects in areas like science, health, agriculture and, citizenship – helping them to grow confidence, independence, resilience, and compassion.

The 4-H in- classroom school clubs meet monthly in October through April. All classrooms participating in the school club option will elect club officers. Monthly program topics can be selected from the attached program list.

Cost is \$2.00 - \$5.00 per participant.

Monthly Lesson Topic	
<b>October</b>	<b>Leadership: Introduction to 4-H</b> Students learn about 4-H and the program. Students will do club officer nominations. President, Vice President, Secretary, Reporter and Club Assistant.
<b>November</b>	<b>Leadership &amp; Parliamentary Procedure</b> Nominee will deliver their brief speech and students will vote for their club officers.
<b>December</b>	<b>4-H Club Officer Installation and Summer Camp Promotion</b> 4-H will have their officer installation ceremony and class will conduct their official first club meeting. Jefferson County 4-H will take a few minutes to promote their summer camp program.
<b>January</b>	<b>Leadership &amp; Selected Program for School</b> Students will experience how a 4-H club should run. Club members and officers will host their first club meeting. Students will open their club meeting utilizing the script agenda and other resources shared with students.
<b>February</b>	<b>Leadership &amp; Selected Program for School</b> Students will experience the running of their 4-H Club. 4-H will develop a lesson based on school selection.
